



DISCOVER CUBA – EDUCATION, HISTORY, MUSIC & CULTURE

September 14 -24, 2014

Witness for Peace is organizing a **People-to-People licensed trip** that will allow U.S. citizens to legally travel to Cuba. This trip is designed for people who are interested in learning about the Cuban people, their education programs, political and social history, and their culture, with a special focus on the effects of US policies on Cuban people. Participants will gain insights into Cuba's life-long education; primary, secondary and universities. The itinerary will include meetings with professionals, families, elected officials, neighborhood organizing committees, and visits to many educational, political, religious, and cultural sites.



This is a legally licensed People-to-People delegation, which will offer a full-time schedule of educational exchange activities that will result in meaningful interaction between the travelers and individuals in Cuba.

Participants in this delegation will:

- Learn about Cuban national priorities, such as universal education and health care.
- Learn about the effects of the U.S. embargo on the Cuban educational, health, political and food systems. Understand how the embargo and other US policies and practices affect Cuban families and communities and learn what folks in the US can do in solidarity with Cuba.
- Visit schools at all levels to meet directly with Cuban citizens.
- Meet with scholars, musicians, artists and members of arts and culture organizations to understand how Cuba's unique history has shaped modern life for Cubans



Cost: \$1,680 plus \$75 visa fee and airfare (\$150 deposit due by July 14, remaining balance due August 14). This cost includes all meals, accommodations, facilitation, interpretation, and transportation while in Cuba. Your fee also covers an orientation/training session and extensive reading materials and action tools distributed both before and after the delegation.
