

WITNESS FOR PEACE INTERN APPLICATION

Time Commitment and Expectations:

Interns with the Witness for Peace- Upper Midwest (WFP-UMW) are requested to work at least eight hours per week for at least four months; shorter time periods may be negotiated for specific projects. All internships are unpaid, but students are encouraged to apply for university credit and/or funding through their home institution; WFP-UMW will work with professors or university staff to fulfill requirements for credit or fellowships. While projects will vary, interns with WFP-UMW can expect to gain hands-on experience in areas such as human rights, social and environmental justice, and grassroots organizing.

Who is eligible?

Most interns with Witness for Peace-Upper Midwest are students, but we encourage anyone who is interested in working with us to submit an application. The most important criteria for interning with Witness for Peace are commitment and passion for the issues on which we work. While the WFP-UMW office is based in Minneapolis, interns can work remotely from other locations in the Midwest. We do request that interns living in the Twin Cities metro area work from our office.
